





HILLYARD TECH TALK

HVACR—Certification Announcement

On February 8, 2017 the Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning and Refrigeration students took the EPA Section 608 certification test. The following students received the **Universal Technician**:

Section 608 of the Federal Clean Air Act requires that all persons who maintain, service, repair, or dispose of appliances that contain refrigerants, be certified in proper refrigerant handling techniques as of November 14, 1994. There are four (4) categories of technician certification:

Type 1: Persons who maintain, service or repair small appliance must be certified as Type 1 technicians

Type 2: Persons, who maintain, service, repair, or dispose of High or Very High Pressure appliances, except small appliances and Motor Vehicle air conditioning systems, must be certified as Type 2 technicians

Type 3: Persons, who maintain, service, repair, or dispose of Low Pressure appliances must be certified as type 3 technicians

Universal Technicians: Persons, who maintain, service or repair both Low and High pressure equipment, as well as Small appliances, must be certified as Universal Technicians

Parker Rotterman took and passed the **HVAC Excellence Employment Ready Electrical** exam. This 100 question exam covers: components, meter usage, safety, theory, trouble-shooting, fundamentals of motors and capacitors, interpreting electrical diagrams.
